New Business

- Ken Majors did One sewer last one before royal buffalo
- Motion to fix the 3 sewer lines, the motion was seconded and approved.

Safety Equipment

- Discussion on purchasing a utility locator device.
- Options range from \$1,500 to \$3,000.
- The board is leaning toward a \$1,500 model that has been proven to detect ductile iron at 9 feet.

• Due June 30, Jeff and Kelsey to work on the application

Road work for 2025

- Recent asphalt patches on Spring Beauty and Royal Buffalo were discussed. Concerns were raised about:
 - High costs (\$9,000 total, ~\$15/sq ft).
 - Inconsistencies in asphalt thickness (2 vs. 4 inches) and recycled vs. fresh asphalt use.
 - o County's double standards—requiring higher standards from the district while doing lower-quality repairs themselves.

- Manhole Issue: A grade ring is needed at the manhole in front of a house on Royal. Current setup creates a hazard like a "speed bump."
- Oxford Road Work: Recycled asphalt covered newly installed valves and manholes; coordination with the contractor is needed to prevent future obstructions.

Water Quality Report

- Posted from Buffalo Mountain and will be posted shortly
- Lead and copper sampling is pending. Supplies have not yet arrived.
- Volunteers and board members to coordinate collection from designated homes. Copper has been the only issue in the past.

Tank Update

 Tank Diving: Scheduled for the second week of July. Purpose is to inspect the floor, replace cathodic anodes, and check for cracks or leaks.

Sewer Project with Stan Miller Construction:

- Uncertainty remains about scheduling; tied to Buffalo Mountain projects.
- Risk that the work may not happen this summer due to their workload.
- Discussion about securing a contract for next year if delays continue.
